What we know about Flight MH370

- 00:17, Mar 8: Malaysia Airlines Flight MH370 carrying 239 people departs Kuala Lumpur International Airport bound for Beijing
- 01:21: Plane's transponder - which identifies aircraft, location and altitude - disabled
- 01:30-02:15: Malaysian and Thai military radars show aircraft turning sharply to west and then north
- 08:11: Inmarsat satellite picks up automatic "handshake" data between aircraft and ground station indicating plane was still flying seven hours after losing contact with air traffic control
- 08:16: Evidence of further "partial handshake" at this time still being analyzed by experts
- 09:16: Next scheduled contact - no response from aircraft

Flight detected by radar. Estimated routes based on Inmarsat satellite analysis. Plane traveling at 400 knots (740km/h). Traveling at 450 knots (830km/h).

United line represents possible locations of plane when it sent final satellite signal at 08:11.
