# The Faculty's Early Career Researchers Recognized Internationally

Approximately 20% of the Faculty of Accountancy (FACT) academic members with a Doctorate are early career researchers (ECR) who are within five to eight years from their Doctorate graduation. These ECR contribute significantly towards FACT's advancements in teaching and curriculum development, research, innovation, and consultancy.

The ASEAN Future Sustainable Leaders (AFSL) 2021 Malaysia recently appointed three of FACT's ECR as competition

screening committee. AFSL Malaysia, hosted by the International University of Malaya-Wales, is a case competition in which secondary and tertiary students from all around Malaysia offered their ideas on transdisciplinary challenges relating to the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). The AFSL Malaysia winners advanced to the AFSL Regional, where they interacted and competed with the AFSL Philippines and AFSL Indonesia champions. Representing the Sustainability and Governance research cluster, the three FACT's ECR were Dr. Mira Susanti Amirrudin, Dr. Nur Syuhada Jasni, and Dr. Seri Ayu Masuri Md Daud. As the screening committee members, they were responsible for evaluating and judging the contestants' pre-recorded video presentations and written



reports according to a set of pre-determined rubrics. These appointments demonstrate FACT's ECR knowledge and professional judgment in SDG-related domains being recognized by the outside world.

On other occasions, different universities and organisations have invited a number of FACT's ECR to talk as guest speakers. International universities also appointed several of them as visiting scholars. Dr. Nurulhuda Abd Rahman, for example, has been asked to speak on Islamic Legal Maxims for Shariah Audit in Islamic Banking at Sekolah Tinggi Ekonomi Islam (SEBI), Indonesia. The school has also designated Dr. Nurulhuda as a research expert.




The Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA) has rolled out the CIMA Global University and Academic Excellence Awards to acknowledge the various roles that academicians have played in the success of CIMA students and graduates. Through the CIMA Academic Partner Excellence Awards, CIMA wants to give the award recipients visibility and standing among employers and students by highlighting the institution as a premier partner. The award will also raise the institutional profile within the global accounting profession and give the institution an unparalleled competitive advantage.



CIMA has received 400 nominations and two of them are UiTM Faculty of Accountancy lecturers, who have been shortlisted as the top five finalists, and they received two awards respectively. Assoc Prof Dr. Tuan Zainun Tuan Mat has received the Global Gold award for CIMA Teaching Excellence Award (influential lecturer) category, and Global silvers awards for CIMA Campus Culture Excellence awards category. This award recognises a CIMA subject lecturer who has demonstrated excellent engagement with CIMA students and effectively helped them to enhance their understanding of the subject taught. Professor Dr. Datin Suzana Sulaiman won the the regional champion (Asia Pacific) title for CIMA Teaching Excellence Award (CIMA Coursework Teaching) category. She also received CIMA Research Excellence Awards for Outstanding Contribution in Malaysia category. CIMA Research Excellence Award recognises researchers and research teams that have conducted landmark research efforts on a subject or topic related to the CIMA syllabus, such as accounting, digital finance, strategy, and more. 

Dr. Nizal has been invited as a speaker to the Universiti of Bangka Belitung, where economists from all over Indonesia attended this virtual online seminar. With a theme of "The Recovery of National Economic Performance aftermath the Pandemic Covid 19 for structural reform of economic policy, he presented a paper titled "An Insight into the Issue of Graduate Mismatch and Underemployment in Malaysia and the GIG Economy."

He focused on the unemployment issue among Malaysian university graduates, believing that the jobless rate had risen drastically due to industries' failure to absorb new labour into the labour market. He spoke explicitly on underemployment, which refers to workers who do not make full use of their education and talents. He believes that unless these problems are handled promptly, they will limiting the nation's economic potential. He suggested one approach to resolve this by encouraging and expanding the GIG economy.








#### MQBS Higher Degree Research Funding: Puan Zairul Nurshazana

- -2nd in the World and 1st in Malaysia for Strategic Business Reporting (SBR)

Hannah shared about consistency throughout the semester as one of the keys to success, besides discussing with lecturer and fellow friends among those. Good time management is also necessary in ensuring that review sessions can be arranged without sacrificing time for self and family. After all, education, family, and self-care are all equally vital.

Nur Afiqah Mohamad Fazil has won 1st place in Malaysia and 7th in the world for Advanced Performance Management in September 2021 sitting.

To succeed in the exams, she recommends all students to be well prepared by covering the entire syllabus and working through past exam papers. When preparing for Professional level papers, it's also vital to look through ACCA's test resources, examiner reports and technical articles.

It is critical that each student to answer the entire paper, including all questions and sections of questions. Time management is crucial, and if students are having trouble with one section, they should immediately proceed to the next.





Nur Izzah Zarifah Mohd Zahir has won 1st place in Malaysia and 3rd in the world for Financial Management in September 2021 sitting.

According to Izzah, "It's critical to have a clear goal in mind. Every time I study, I remember why I started this professional study in the first place, which is to give back to my family. That's how I've kept myself going on this adventure".

She added that, "There are no shortcuts available. The only way to pass was to thoroughly study textbook and exercise book. Make sure you're doing the exercises by hand, not just in your brain.. It's not even similar when we do the hands on, because it definitely helps in determining what you haven't grasped and where you should refocus".

# ONLINE TEACHING AND LEARNING FOR ACCOUNTING SUBJECT FOR SPM EXAMINATION CANDIDATES

The Online Supplementary Teaching and Coaching for Accounting subject for the Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) Examination candidates have been held successfully at Sekolah Menengah Puncak Alam 3 (SMKPA 3) from 28 July through 29 September 2021 and at Sekolah Menengah Puncak Alam (SMKPA) from 6 August until 29 October 2021. This project was initiated by the Research, Industry, Community, Alumni, Entrepreneurship, and Networking (RICAEN) Office and directed by the Industry, Community, Alumni, and Networking (ICAN) Coordinator, Dr. Kamaruzzaman Muhammad.

Prof. Dr. Razana Juhaida Johari and Dr. Seri Ayu Masuri Md Daud led the program at SMKPA 3. A total of 19 lecturers, 19 Bachelor's Degree and Professional Program's students, and 42 SMKPA 3 students were directly involved. Meanwhile, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Norziaton Ismail Khan headed the project for SMKPA. This program involved 9 lecturers, 19 Bachelor's Degree and Professional Program's students, and 56 SMKPA students.

This program is seen as one of the Faculty's efforts to contribute to the local community by imparting their knowledge in accounting to the students who will sit for the SPM examination soon. This initiative was intended to restore students' confidence and motivation in learning and excel in the accounting subject despite the fact that they faced various online learning challenges.

The program received highly positive responses and feedback from the students and teachers involved. Given the significant impacts on the students receiving the online teaching and coaching services, the schools even requested that this program remain a continued collaboration effort for the foreseeable future.

## Transfer Knowledge Program of Accounting and Tax to Asnaf Entrepreneurs

This is a collaboration program between our faculty members and Teras Sdn Bhd. Two programs which had been successfully held in December 2021 (15-16 and 29-30 December 2021) at Mardhiyyah Hotel and Suites, Shah Alam are part of the training activities to fulfil the requirement of the Knowledge Transfer Program Grant.

Speakers consist of three lecturers from the Faculty of Accountancy and one from Faculty of Law. In addition, there are another two team members from the industry. With aim to transfer the accounting knowledge to the asnaf entrepreneurs, I-Asnaf ACT is being used as the medium to help ease the accounting process for their business. I-Asnaf ACT is a basic accounting template developed using Advance Excel Worksheet, containing all important accounting aspect such as financial statement, cash flow and even inventory records. Besides, the entrepreneurs are being exposed to the basic knowledge of tax computation.

It is a hands-on training to help them familiar with the template and able to apply them to their own business in the future. It is hopes that with the success of this event, it will inspire us together to contribute towards the economic growth of asnaf.




